In the Classroom

Literacy - This week we will continue learning new strategies to become even better readers. We



will be learning about Repeating Parrot, who helps us notice parts of the book that repeat. We will also learn about Stretchy the Snake, who helps us stretch out the word so we can hear all

the sounds. During phonics we will finish learning about the consonant digraphs sh, ch, th, wh, and ck.

Writing— We will share our small moment stories with the class and begin learning the difference between fact and opinion. We will also begin our own opinion writing.





Math— We will continue working on addition and subtraction story problems. We will learn how to solve subtraction problems using a number line. We will also learn how to identify whether an addition

story problem has an unknown partner or an unknown total.

Science— We will begin learning about balance and motion. This week we will us counterweights to balance objects in a stable position. We will also predict whether a position will be stable



or unstable and how to test our predictions.
